We believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of all things visible and invisible (*Genesis 1:1; Acts 17:24-28; Hebrews 11:3*).

We believe in Jesus Christ, God's one and only Son, our one and only Savior (*John 1:14; 1 John 4:9; John 3:16; 2 Peter 3:18*) who was both fully human and fully divine, conceived of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and lived a sinless life (*Matthew*

21:11; John 19:19; John 1:14; Romans 5:15-17; Colossians 2:9, 1 *John 1:1; Matthew 1:18, Luke 1:26-*38, 1 Peter 1:22) who suffered and was crucified (Luke 23:1-46), who died and was buried, and who rose again bodily from the dead on the third day (Luke 23:44-24:8; John 20:24-29; 1 Corinthians 15:3-8), who ascended into Heaven and now sits at the right hand of the Father (Luke 22:69; Acts 1:1-9, Colossians 3:1), and who will return to earth to judge both the living and the dead (Matthew 24:36-42; John 14:1-3; acts 1:10-11; 10:39-42; 1 *Peter* 4:5).

We believe in the Holy Spirit, Who is a personal and active part of the triune God (*John 16:5* -15; Acts 1:7-8; Romans 8:26,27), and who indwells every Christian (1 Corinthians 3:16; 6:19; 2 Timothy 1:14).

We believe in the Bible – God's Holy Word. We believe God inspired the original writings of the Scripture, and therefore the Bible is completely trustworthy in all parts (*Mark* 12:36, John 14:26; 16:12-15; Acts 1:16; 1 Corinthians 2:12-13; 2 Timothy 3:14-16; 2 Peter 1:20-21).

We

accept the Bible as the final authority of all matter of faith and practice (*Isaiah 40:8; Matthew 5:18;* 24:35; Romans 15:4; Hebrews 4:12)

We believe that people created by God willfully be earned, but is given to us only through the blood of Jesus Christ and by God's grace (*Matthew 26:28; Romans 5:1-11; 6:23; Ephesians 2:8-10; Hebrews* 10:19-22; I Peter 1:18, 19; 1 John 1:7).

We believe that we must respond to God by:

- Admitting our sin and our need for God's grace (*Romans 3:23, Titus 3:3-7*)
- Believing and confessing the truth about Jesus (*Matthew* 10:32; *Romans* 10:9,10)
- Turning away from sin (repenting – *Luke* 24:45-47; *Acts* 3:19; 17:30).
- Trusting Jesus as Savior and Lord (*Romans 10:11-13, Philippians 2:11*)
- Being obedient in baptism (immersed) into Christ (*Acts* 2:38, *Romans* 6:1-4)

We believe in the church of Jesus Christ's universal church, consisting of all Christians everywhere (*Matthew 16:13-18; Acts* 2:14-47; *Ephesians 1:22,23*)

We believe in the church's mission: making disciples of all nations, baptizing them and teaching them to obey all of Jesus' commands (*Matthew 28:18-20*).

We believe that marriage is only between a man and woman. (Matthew 19)





We also support **Birthright** of Richmond, **Woodburn Christian Children's Home** near Fort Wayne, Indiana and **Napa Na Si Reservation** in South Dakota.

Internationally, we support **CRAM** with CY & Patricia Kim as the missionaries in Asia. CY and Patricia Kim are undertaking many projects in this little corner of the world, near North Korea, and we should support them in prayer as well as with our financial support. CCCC supports Danny Buegar and his family in Liberia and participates in the Annual Samaritan's Purse, **Operation Christmas Child** project. Missions is excited to begin their support of Journey Missions International. This is a ministry that in 2017 will begin to provide church leadership development, outreach, professional conseling and counseling training. The ministry, led by Joshua and Victoria Baah-Binney, will begin in their home country of Ghana, focused initially in the capital city of Accra. Expansion throughout Ghana and other countries in Africa may follow. The ministry began its board formation in 2015 and has begun obtaining both American and Ghanaian nonprofit status.
